### **SECRETARY MINUTES**

Louisville Area Daylily Society

#### February 16, 2017

The February meeting of the Louisville Area Daylily Society was held February 16, 2017, at Trinity Presbyterian Church, Middletown, Kentucky.

President Carrithers called the meeting to order at 7:10 pm. She welcomed all of the members to the meeting and welcomed a new member, Kathy Brown.

We began the evening with Sally Fensterer updating members on the responses she has received from her letters of inquiry to several hybridizers regarding their interest in participating in this year's Hybridizers Reward Program (HRP). Scott Elliott indicated interest and has made a very generous proposal of providing 68 plants. Bob Selman just responded that day and will put a list of plants he would include in a proposal. Will Marchant responded but declined due to lack of inventory. Margo Reed/Jim Murphy declined due to lack of inventory as well as being an open garden at this year's National Convention. Sally has not yet heard back from Jamie Gossard, Phil Korth or Eric Simpson.

Sally indicated that she had reviewed the number of members who received HRP plants over the last six years and the average was 27.5 people over that period. Most people received two plants each year.

Sally gave the hybridizers a deadline of March 1<sup>st</sup> to present their proposals, so we will plan to make a final decision at the March meeting.

Michael Stephens presented a slideshow of photos of the daylilies Scott Elliott included in his proposal. At member request, he showed us Bob Selman's 2016 introductions so we could get an idea of his style of daylilies and then did the same type of overview of Jamie Gossard's recent introductions.

At 8:15 p.m. we broke from the slideshow to enjoy refreshments and a period of socializing.

At approximately 8:30 the meeting reconvened and Ellen announced the following events coming this spring:

Ellen reminded us about the Club's plan to charter a bus to take members to Cincinnati, OH on Saturday June 3<sup>rd</sup> to visit three nurseries and have lunch at a local barbecue restaurant. Vice President Becky Scarboro has been coordinating the trip and is enthusiastic about the nurseries as well as lunch! A sign-up sheet was circulated at the meeting for members to indicate interest and pay \$10 to hold our seat on the bus. We will get the money back if we actually go on the trip. If there is space left after members have had the chance to sign up, we will be able to bring a guest to fill the rest of the bus.

The January Treasurer's Report went out to members the day of the meeting and additional copies were made available at the meeting. A question was asked about the Professional Fees which were included in the Report. Andrea King, Treasurer, told members that we are in the process of being registered as a 501 C non-profit organization. We've hired an accountant to do the filing for us. The day of the meeting we received

approval from the IRS. The filing fee was \$275 and the accountant's fee was \$400. Donna Willett moved that the Treasurer's Report be accepted, the motion was seconded by Karen Sidebottom and it was approved by the members.

President Carrithers indicated that the Mid-Winter Symposium had been held in Nashville the weekend before. The members who went had a good weekend there. Historically, it has been held Friday afternoon/evening through Sunday morning. Attendance has been down so they are considering shortening it to just Saturday and Sunday. She asked for feedback about that and there was no strong opinion expressed.

Andrea King indicated she sent out the latest member roster by email the day of the meeting. Please review it and make sure your information is correct and that it accurately reflects the status of your paid dues for 2017. Please let Andrea know if any corrections are needed.


