## Minutes from LADS Meeting on January 18, 2018

LADS members gathered and shared a delicious hot meal before the official meeting.

Our newly elected LADS President, Linda Luck, welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order. We had one visitor for the evening, Kate Pfeifer, who became our newest member.

The Treasurer's Report, along with a 4 year comparison of income and expenses, was distributed by Andrea King. Karen Sidebottom moved to approve and accept the report. Michael Stephens seconded the motion.

The Minutes from our December meeting were published in the Newsletter. Andrea King moved to approve the minutes as published and Nan Upton seconded the motion.

Linda encouraged the membership to make plans to help with our two sales and to attend the Region and National Conventions. All these events provide opportunities to meet daylily people and to further our own knowledge and expertise.

Questions were raised about how many official AHS Display Gardens we have in our area and what percent of our LADS members belong to AHS. The AHS website lists 21 official Display Gardens in Region 10 (Kentucky and Tennessee). To find local ones go to the AHS website under Region 10. Andrea King will research the answer to the question about LADS members who belong to AHS and report back at our next meeting.

Considerable time was spent discussing membership and recruitment. Some suggestions mentioned were:

- -Handouts for our sales listing local members who are willing to invite visitors to their gardens
- -Open garden days
- -"Each one reach one" . . . members invite others to join us for various events
- -An article written and published in the garden section of the newspaper
- -Contact community colleges and high schools with horticulture classes
- -Publicize local hybridizers

Please bring any additional ideas that come to mind to our next meeting. Outreach is important and necessary if we are to be a thriving society.

Heads up: LADS is scheduled to host the June 2020 Regional Convention. We will need open gardens for the event and LOTS of workers to make the meeting this success.

The Hybridizer Reward Program (HRP) was discussed at length. In the past we have purchased plants which are their latest introductions from one of the larger hybridizers. Members grow them for two years and then return two fans for our fall auction. This gets some of the newer plants on the market in our local gardens. A suggestion was made that perhaps we might try to work with several smaller hybridizers this year and by getting fewer plants from each one we could become familiar with more hybridizers, especially those who might not introduce a large number of plants in any given year. We would still ask for double fans. Cleo Philon will chair the HRP for 2018. In the past few years it seems that we've had an average of 29 members participate in the HRP so maybe 35 plants would be enough to order. Some of the possible hybridizers mentioned were: Jim Murphy/Margo Reed, Sandy/Mike Holmes, Dan Bachman and Joel Polson/Doug Sterling. Think about whose plants you'd like to grow and come with your ideas to share at our February meeting.

Our Bus Trip was also discussed. What would you prefer? Some ideas mentioned were: a one day visit to the Northern Mecca (July 6, 7 or 8), a visit to several hybridizers' gardens, a visit to a Botanical Garden and/or nursery shopping. A lively discussion was had but no decision was made. The bus trip is something else to consider and come prepared to discuss at our February meeting.

Cody Moran, the Community Outreach Director from Louisville Grows was unable to be with us for a program but we had a great program with members sharing their ideas and suggestions! At 8:26 Michael Stephens moved that the meeting be adjourned. Betty Wilborn seconded the motion.
