We voted during the meeting and selected Phil and Luella Korth of Pinewood Daylilies in Wisconsin and Richard Norris of Ashwood Daylilies in Ohio to provide our plants this year. Becky Scarboro and Nelson Ratchford are scheduled to have their garden open that date for a benefit event, so it made sense to have Luck-y-Ray Gardens open that day as well.
