Minutes from LADS July 19th meeting

The LADS members met at Wallitsch's Garden Center at 6:30p.m. with their brown bag suppers. President Linda Luck called the meeting to order about 6:30p.m.. The minutes as published in the Newsletter were reviewed. Donna Willett made a motion to accept them and Karen Sidebottom seconded the motion. The Treasurer's report had been e-mailed earlier

in the day to the membership. Becky Scarboro made a motion to accept the report

and Phil Raisle seconded the motion.

There were comments on several past events from Linda and from the membership.

- A. The DSL Annual Show and Sale on June 23rd were successful with 226 daylily entries for the Show. The Sale that accompanied the Show was also successful and the few plants that were left at the end of the day were taken to Lexington by Richard Porter for their Sale on Sunday.
- B. Reports on the Open Gardens at Linda and Ray's and at Becky and Nelson's were very positive. In fact, in spite of the heat Linda reported that they had as many afternoon visitors as they did in the morning. Becky and Nelson also sold plants which benefitted St Joseph Church's "Save the Steeple" campaign.
- C. The weeding and plant sale at the LADS garden was a challenge because of the nut sedge and heat but with the help of many hands the weeds were pulled and plants were sold from the LADS bed and from Doris Stonska's

Garden, netting the club \$305 plus \$40 in LADS bucks. Karen Sidebottom distributed the LADS bucks for working on July 14th at the meeting.

Linda reminded the group about our Dig and Preparation Day on August 1st beginning at 8:00. She read the names of those who had volunteered at the last meeting and encouraged others to come help if they could. Again, many hands will make the work easier and quicker. Set up for the Sale will be August 3rd at Wallitsch's after 4:00. Workers should plan to arrive on Sale day by 8:30. The Sale runs from 9:00-12:00 for the public followed by clean up. Daffodil, iris and hosta groups will be joining us at Wallitsch's for the Sale.

The next item on the agenda was conversation about LADS hosting the Regional Convention in 2020. Some initial conversation about this was had after the weeding was finished at Doris' on July 14th. A primary concern was about tour gardens...Do we have enough DIFFERENT gardens so that we are not repeating gardens from the National Convention in 2016? Do we have members (or others) who are willing to have their gardens open for the bus tours? Besides the gardens, there is a concern that we have only so many active members in LADS and are there enough who will commit to take an active role in planning and executing a

Regional Convention? A decision will need to be made NO LATER THAN OUR AUGUST MEETING so Regional staff can be informed of our decision and plan accordingly.

Cleo Philon reminded the group that our August meeting is the time to return the Hybridizer Reward Plants from Paul Owen (2016). If your plant has not increased sufficiently to return two fans and still have some for yourself, keep it for another year. Cleo will organize the plants that are returned for the auction so that duplicates (if there are any) are sold at the same time. Phil Raisle will be our auctioneer so be prepared for a fast paced auction! Cleo also reminded us that the list of plants and people who have them is on the LADS website. For our August meeting Karen and Danny Sidebottom will prepare the meat (probably BBQ) and members will be responsible for sides and desserts.

The business part of the meeting finished at 6:50 with Ray Clark making the motion to end the meeting and Michael Stephens seconding it. A program by Jeff Wallitsch followed on container gardening. Before our very eyes, Jeff put together a gorgeous blue container stuffed full of lovely plants. . . . a sight to behold! He also talked about the importance of using good soil, which will feed the plants and then a bit about designing containers. Jeff used the terms "thriller (for the plant you want as focal point) "fillers" (plants that will fill the space around the thriller and "spillers" (the plants that will hang over the side of the pot). Jeff designed a container for shade since he said few people know how to use shade plants well since usually there are no flowers but a great deal of texture and variations on the theme of green! He also made suggestions for how we can "change out" different plants when they are tired or don't do well, add fall and winter embellishments and add spring blooming flowers to make the container work for four seasons! After Jeff's demonstration he graciously allowed us some shopping time and many members went home with soil, plants, containers and other garden items. Wallitsch's Garden Center was a comfortable and lovely site for a July LADS meeting and we thank Jeff for the hospitality.
