The Officers and a couple of other members met for some brainstorming since then and have put together a rough plan for a modified convention, loosely based on the

format used for the Northern Mecca annual event. I will present that to you at the September meeting. Although the Officers support this plan, it will still be up to the LADS membership to decide if you want to move forward with it. If at all possible, please plan to attend our September meeting on Thursday September 20th. We'll be back at Trinity Presbyterian Church and the meeting will start at 6:30. Please come with an open mind and prepared to discuss a new option!

Minutes from August 16th Meeting

LADS members gathered in Karen and Danny Sidebottom's lovely gardens for our August meeting and the auction of the Hybridizer Reward Plants from Paul Owen (2016 plants). After a delicious pot luck supper provided by the members, President Linda Luck called the meeting to order and welcomed our returning member, Loretta Aberli and her sister, Kathy Ashbacher (who is our newest member).

The minutes from the July meeting which were published in the Newsletter were reviewed. Ellen Carrithers made a motion that they be accepted as

published and Kathy Brown seconded the motion. Our treasurer, Andrea King, had e-mailed the financial report to members earlier. Mary Jane Beale made a motion that the treasurer's report be accepted and Sally Fensterer seconded the motion.

Then Linda gave a summary of the Wallitsch Plant Sale from August 4th. Our net earnings were \$949.16. With all plants being \$5.00 a bundle, we sold LOTS of plants!! Anita Kvinta volunteered to write a thank you note to Wallitsch's and thank Jeff for his presentation/demonstration on container gardening at our July meeting as well as for providing the venue for our sale. Linda asked that Anita also mention in the note that we'd like to come back next year.

In July we began the discussion about hosting the Regional Convention in 2020. Considerable time at this August meeting was spent listing all the committees/chairpersons needed to host a Regional Convention such as: hotel and food accommodations, registration, bus captains, silent auction/raffle, registration and bus plants from hybridizers, etc. etc. etc. plus the need for at least 4 or 5 tour gardens. At this point we had only two: Linda Luck and Ray Clark's and Karen and Danny Sidebottom's gardens. Some one suggested Cave Hill Cemetery as a possibility for a stop on the garden tour route. Another suggestion was made that perhaps the Waterfront Botanical Garden might be a place to consider but we don't know how much progress will have been made by 2020. The concern was voiced that the health and stamina of some of our members who in previous years

took active roles in such meetings but are no longer able to do so. After considering all the aspects of hosting the Regional Convention in 2020, the group voted at this time it is not possible to make that commitment. There was an abstention but no “yes” votes. The remainder of the votes were “no”. Linda will convey this information to the Regional Director and see if we need to make a monetary contribution to the Region for the Daylily Appeal since some of the money from the Regional goes to pay for that publication.

It's time to do the Popularity Poll for 2018. Linda reminded members they need to vote for up to ten of their favorite daylilies, and she distributed ballots to anyone who wanted one. The ballots could be completed at the meeting, returned to her, and she would mail them to Libby Hickman who coordinates that process for Region 10. Linda also referred us to the location of the on-line ballot on the AHS website. Michael Stephens said he would create a link from LADS to AHS/ADS for ease in voting. The deadline for voting is September 1st!

Linda then shared with the group some upcoming events of interest. On Monday, August 20th at 7:00 David Kirchhoff and Mort Morss will be at the DSL meeting speaking about their hybridizing program. DSL has invited all the daylily groups in the area to attend. DSL meets at Farmdale Church of the Nazarene, 6501 Vandred Ave – Located off Smyrna Rd., about 0.1 miles before Outer Loop.

The Iris Society invited us to their October 4th meeting at St. Mark's on Frankfort Ave for a 7:00 program about the Waterfront Botanical Garden.

Michael Stephens reminded us that it is time to consider officers for 2019! This will be discussed further at our September meeting.

Michael Stephens then made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Sally Fensterer seconded it.

The meeting was followed by a lively auction by Phil Raisle of the Paul Owen plants. Many members went home with additions to their gardens! LADS thanks Cleo Philon for the fine job he's done with the Hybridizer Reward Program for this year!
