### **Short Summary of our September LADS Gathering**

**Members of LADS gathered on September 20th at 6:30 to share a pot luck supper and hear two speakers from the Cincinnati area, Ron Wilson and Rita Heikenfeld. The evening was spent engaged in their presentations and MANY questions from our members and answers from our speakers! A few highlights of the presentations follow:**

**Ron spoke about how the nutsedge and crabgrass have really prospered this year because of the hot, humid weather and our moist soil! LADS members could relate**

**to the nutsedge remarks after pulling bags of it from our garden earlier in the summer. Ron had taken a walk around the grounds of Trinity Presbyterian Church and gathered some specimens for “show and tell”, among them some bag worms! He commented on the items he’d found and how they might be dealt with organically. The “Yardboy”, as he calls himself, gave us a great handout called “From the Garden to the Kitchen” with MANY pointers to ponder. He emphasized the importance of planting trees and caring for our pollinators. Ron carefully distinguished between our native bees and their habits and needs and the honeybees, that are imports, but are valued for their ability to make honey. (Our native bees are great pollinators but don’t make honey!)**

**The second half of the evening was spent with Rita who is an herbalist. Not only did she bring many herbs for “show and tell” but she also shared some recipes for making edibles and other items from the herbs we grow. Her handout on herbs was very comprehensive.**

**Ron and Rita brought plants with them which we used as door prizes. When they finished their presentations it was getting late so there was no formal meeting.**

**President Linda Luck’s mother had been rushed to the emergency room earlier that evening so Becky presided**

**and introduced our program. These are just some notes from the evening written to share with those who were unable to join us.**
