February 28, 2019

they will be sending and Michael Stephens has
put it on the LADS website for your
convenience. These will be the plants to be
returned for the HRP Auction in 2021.

Linda then gave a summary of the presentation which she made at the Mid-Winter Symposium concerning our LADS modified 2020 Regional Convention plans. (Please see last month's minutes for complete details.) She reported that the ideas were warmly received and several individuals complimented her on finding a creative way to have the gathering without all the expense and work that is usually

entailed in a summer Regional meeting. Linda asked the group for volunteers to serve on a steering committee along with the LADS Board, Michael Stephens and Karen Sidebottom

As part of Linda's report on the Symposium she mentioned a few additional items:

- -At present there is no host for the National Convention after 2020.
- --Lorene Crone mentioned that Region X membership at the beginning of 2018 was 332 and now at the beginning of 2019 it is 310.
- -The Lenington Award went to White Eyes Pink Dragon (2006) by Jamie Gossard.

Linda also mentioned that David Kirchhoff is doing well after some medical issues during the Mid-Winter. Your kind thoughts and prayers will be appreciated.

The business meeting was adjourned at 7:45 with a motion by Karen Sidebottom, seconded by Donna Willett.

Our speaker for the evening was June Sandercock from Ladybug Lane Landscaping. June had helped conduct the sale of Marjorie Cox's garden last summer and remembered some of the LADS members who visited and purchased Marjorie's daylilies. June's topic for the evening was "Butterflies in Biocrisis". Besides some statistics and information about various species of butterflies common in Kentucky, June also distributed a wonderful list of host

and nectar plants for our gardens. She encouraged us to research the kinds of butterflies we wish to attract to our gardens and then plant their host and nectar plants and "they will come".
