Minutes for May 2019 LADS Meeting

LADS members gathered at the home and beautiful gardens of our president, Linda Luck and Ray Clark for our May meeting. Peonies and iris were the stars of the show!

After a delicious meal of Black Angus hot dogs and hamburgers, grilled by Linda and a couple of her chef friends, and many wonderful sides provided by the members, the meeting was called to order at 7:20. Linda welcomed those members who haven't been with us for a while and also our latest member, Steve Losch from Pendleton, KY, who joined LADS at our Yew Dell plant sale.

The Minutes from our March meeting were approved with the necessary correction about the survey Andrea King did for our Peony Bus Trip. The minutes had recorded that the survey was for the Cincinnati Trip. With that correction made, Andrea moved that the minutes to accepted as published in the Newsletter and Ellen Carrithers seconded the motion. Phil Raisle

made a motion that the Minutes from the April meeting be approved as published and Claudia Wolff seconded the motion. Then the meeting moved on to the Treasurer's report which was e-mailed to members. Claudia Wolff made a motion to accept the report and Karen Sidebottom seconded the motion.

The results of our recent sales were as follows: April 26/27th at Yew Dell made \$1,154.00 and Beechmont Flower Festival on May 11th made \$940.00. Because neither sale was a "sell out", it was suggested that perhaps in the future we should price our plants at \$5.00 rather than \$10.00. Replanting and/or "plant sitting" left over plants isn't always easy and the thought is that people might purchase more plants if they were \$5.00 rather than \$10.00. Members who also belong to DSL have observed that DSL regularly sells out their plants at their various sales and perhaps

it is because they are priced at \$5.00 and people perceive them as a bargain!

The discussion moved on to the donations that have been promised for the Waterfront Botanical Gardens. Linda reminded members that we have 30 donations submitted and if members still wish to make a donation, it needs to be to Marie Seaman NO LATER THAN May 31st in order for us to confirm acceptance. The space at the Garden will include some conifers as well as other companion plants so at this time just how much space will be available for daylilies isn't certain.

Linda gave some reminders for the 2020
Regional Convention (Friday, June 26 and Saturday, June 27, 2020). Registration plants for the Convention will be the Bob Selman HRP plants that would have otherwise been auctioned to members in August 2019. We were asked to plan to let Linda know at the July meeting how many fans we will be bringing back after keeping

two for ourselves. These fans will be collected and then planted in our LADS garden this fall.

The Peony Society bus trip to Chillicothe, OH is on Saturday, May 25. Pick up will be at 7:00 but the location is undecided. It will probably be at the Park and TARC location just off of I-71 at exit 14 (the Crestwood exit). Those scheduled to attend will be notified of the definite location and departure time prior to the departure date. The Park and TARC is right behind the BP/Five Star gas station. For those using GPS the gas station is at 7200 Hwy 329.

June 1st is the bus trip to Cincinnati nurseries. Pick up will be a 8:00 at the same Park and TARC location. Exit 14 (Crestwood). The evening program was the distribution of the 2019 Hybridizer Reward Program daylilies from Sandy and Mike Holmes and from Dan Bachman. Special thanks to Cleo Philon for a fine job of coordinating our HRP again for 2019!! And thanks to Phil Raisle, Ellen Carrithers and Drew Upton for their assistance in distributing the plants. Members left filled with anticipation for growing their newest additions to the garden and imagining how beautiful they will be in a couple years.

We thank Linda and Ray for their hospitality in hosting us for our May LADS gathering.






DAYLILY WITH SILVER EYE
