The Treasurer's report was sent by e-mail prior to the meeting and Ellen Carrithers made a motion that it be accepted. Sally Fensterer seconded the motion.

Our list of scheduled events for 2019 had only two items left on it.

- 1. The Annual Mid-West Peony Society meeting/dinner/auction is on September 20th at 6:00 at Lyndon Town Hall. All are welcome! Members and new members may pay their \$10.00 yearly dues at this meeting.
- 2. Our Fall clean up/mulching day for the LADS bed and planting Bob Selman daylilies for the 2020 Convention will be Saturday, October 12th. Work will begin at 9:00. Michael Stephens will coordinate the mulch trucks. All hands on board will make for a quicker and easier job as we put the daylilies to bed for the winter!

The next item on the agenda was the 2020 Regional Convention. Linda reminded us again of the dates—Friday, June 26th and Saturday, June 27th. Members were asked to bring their Bob Selman HRP daylilies to the October 12th work day at the LADS bed, keeping two fans for themselves. The short business meeting adjourned at 7:10 and the evening's program with Tom Polston and Doug Sterling from Pleasant Valley Gardens in Dayton, OH began. Not only do they hybridize daylilies but they also run a farm with a wide variety of creatures... chickens, ducks, guineas, peacocks and Clydesdale horses. Tom had a beautiful picture of four foals from this year standing with their mothers in the corral. Several LADS members visited Tom and Doug's gardens/farm when they went to Northern Mecca a few years ago. He showed how he prevents weeds in his seedling beds by using heavy black plastic in which he has drilled circles where he plants his seedlings. Pleasant Valley Gardens specializes in "toothy" daylilies and Tom had MANY beautiful pictures to share with us.




